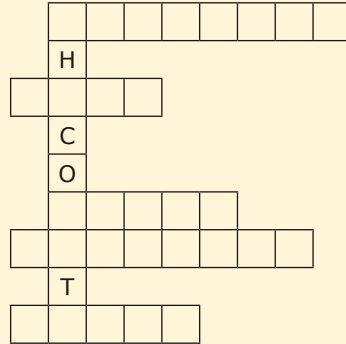

¿Quisiera un café, por favor. **I'd like** a coffee, please.

Para mí una limonada. A lemonade **for me**.

requesting things

The easiest way is simply to say what you want:

Dos cervezas, por favor. Two beers, please.

You can also say:

Para mí, una cerveza. A beer for me.

Otherwise you can use ¿Me puede dar ...? (literally, 'Can you give me ...?') or ¿Me puede traer ...? (literally, 'Can you bring me ...?'):

¿Me puede dar una cerveza, por favor?

Please could I have a beer?

¿Me puede traer una cerveza, por favor?

Please would you bring me a beer?
